- the driver has a readily accessible record of the names of all passengers; and
- there is appropriate adult supervision for the students being conveyed.
- 4.5 In circumstances where students are being conveyed by a rented, private or student activity vehicle classified as a bus (defined in section 3.0), the activity organizer should also ensure that:
 - a) the vehicle and the driver meet the standards set in this guideline;
 - the driver or at least one of the passengers in the vehicle is trained in emergency first aid; and
 - c) all requirements and restrictions established under the <u>Motor Vehicle Act</u> in relation to the operation of commercial vehicles are followed. These rules apply to the hours of service for drivers, commercial log books, and out-of-province trip permits (see <u>Appendix A</u> for a description of the specific requirements and restrictions).

Vehicle guidelines

- 4.6 A student should not be conveyed to an off-site school-related activity in a rented, private vehicle classified as a bus or a student activity vehicle unless:
 - a) it is equipped with a fire extinguisher and a first aid kit;
 - it has received a pre-trip inspection in accordance with the requirements set out in Appendix B; and
 - information respecting accident procedures and contact names and numbers are readily accessible, consistent with <u>Policy 510</u> – <u>Procedures for Accidents Involving</u> a <u>School Vehicle</u>.

Driver qualifications

- 4.7 A person should not be permitted to drive any rented, private or student activity vehicle to convey students to an off-site school-related activity unless the activity organizer is satisfied that the driver:
 - a) is at least 21 years of age;
 - is not a student enrolled in a public school;
 - possesses a valid driver's licence with an appropriate classification for the type of vehicle being driven (see <u>Appendix C</u>); and
 - d) is an experienced driver with a good driving record possessing basic defensive driving skills.
